DISTANCE LEARNERS: TIPS AND TRICKS

1) Create an area dedicated to your studying and homework!





SPRING RECIPIES 🦟



CREPES

1 cup plain flour, sifted

1 cup milk

3 eggs



- 1) Mix milk and eggs well with a wire whisk.
- 2) While stirring the egg mixture, add flour through a wire sieve. Stir continuously to avoid any lumps.
- 3) Let batter sit for 30 minutes.
- 4) When batter is ready, spray an 8 inch skillet with pam and heat over med-high heat.
- 5) Add 1/3 cup batter to hot skillet and swirl to coat. Cook for 2-3 minutes.
- 6) Flip (gently) and cook on the other side for 1-2 min.
- 7) Remove from pan and add filling to warm crepe and roll up.

THUMBPRINT COOKIES

½ cup powdered sugar

1/4 tsp. salt

2 cup plain flour

1 cup soft butter

1 T. vanilla

1 cup finely chopped pecans



Mix sugar, butter, salt, and vanilla together in large stand mixer.

Stir in flour and pecans.

Mix well. Chill in refrigerator for at least 1 hour. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Shape dough into small balls. Place on ungreased baking sheet. Press thumb into center of each ball and flatten slightly. Bake 13-15 minutes or until lightly brown and set. Fill thumbprints with jelly or tinted icing.
